Edna Harmon, now 86, was born in Branch, Louisiana, to the late Woodrow Harmon, Sr. and Alzina Minix Harmon. At an early age, she accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was baptized, beginning a lifelong walk of faith.

She received her formal education and went on to earn her degree as a Licensed Practical Nurse. Edna devoted most of her adult life to serving others through healthcare, working many years at American Legion Hospital in Crowley. She continued her service after the hospital transitioned from its original location on 7th Street to what is now known as Ochsner Acadia General Hospital, where she later retired. She was known for her patience, compassion, consideration, and genuine kindness to all she encountered.

In addition to her nursing career, she also worked as a Life Insurance Agent during a time when personal visits to clients' homes were common, further demonstrating her dedication to caring for others.

Edna was united in holy matrimony to the late Rogers Rose Robinson, and together they built a legacy rooted in faith, love, and family as they raised their fifteen children together. Following her husband's declining health, she faithfully served as steward of West Crowley Cemetery for numerous years, continuing her life of service to the community.

She remained a devoted member of Ambassador Ministries ~ Greater Mt. Zion Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Marcal Poullard, following the pastoral legacy of the late Reverend Keith Matthews and his wife, Annie Matthews.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Rogers Rose Robinson; two sons, Ralph Robinson and Byron Robinson; one daughter, Virginia Robinson Orebo; her parents, Woodrow and Alzina Harmon; two brothers, Woodrow Harmon, Jr. and Frank Harmon; and one sister, Elma Jean Harmon. She carried their memories with love and gratitude, and we find comfort in knowing she has been reunited with them in eternal peace.

Edna, 86, transitioned from earthly labor on Tuesday, March 31, 2026, at a local hospital in Crowley, Louisiana surrounded by her children and grandchildren.

Now rests in God's eternal place.

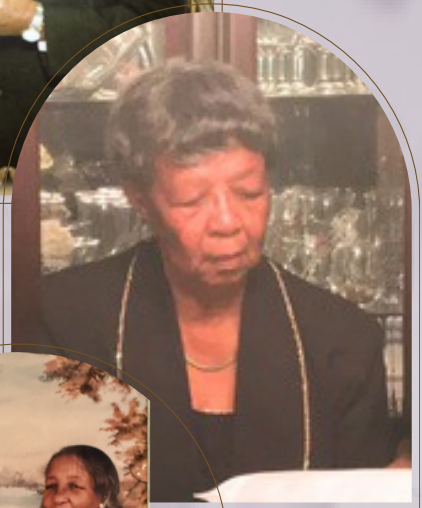
Though we no longer see your face,
