Robert "Bob" E. Kowalski, 81, of Sedalia, MO, passed away at home on Wednesday, February 12, 2025. He was born on July 13, 1943, in Sedalia, the son of Henry Kowalski and Mary (Paxton) Kowalski, who preceded him in death.

Bob's life was marked by his unwavering dedication to his country. He served honorably in the United States Army from 1961 until 1964, stationed overseas in Germany during that time. His service was a testament to his character and commitment. He finished high school, and most of college was through Boeing for further education and classes needed for additional levels of management, which he climbed up in as he worked there. Among various business adventures in his life, he retired from the Boeing Company at the age of 55. Bob spent his retirement mowing his lawn and caring for his pets.

Bob's service extended beyond his military years, as he was actively involved in community work within Boeing, contributing to various charity efforts. His generosity knew no bounds, as he was a giver to many organizations, including St. Jude Research Hospital, Feed the Children, Mercy Ships, and various ministries. His impact on these organizations and the community at large is a testament to his legacy.

Because of work, he lived in Illinois, Ohio, Texas, California, then Wichita, KS, for The Boeing Company with the commercial aircraft division, and lastly, Huntsville, AL (Madison, AL was his physical residence), where he lived when he retired from Boeing (with the Space and Rockets division, specifically the International Space Station modules assembly).

Bob's love extended beyond his service and career, as he leaves behind a loving family. Survivors include his three daughters, Patti Fitzpatrick, Karen Zullig (Jeff), and Jaclyn Kowalski; a son, Brian Kowalski; three grandsons; several great-grandchildren; two brothers, Joseph Kowalski and Henry Kowalski; and a sister, Florence Hayworth.

In addition to his parents, Bob was preceded in death by two brothers, Ernie Kowalski and Ricky Lindsay.
