my cup runneth over.*

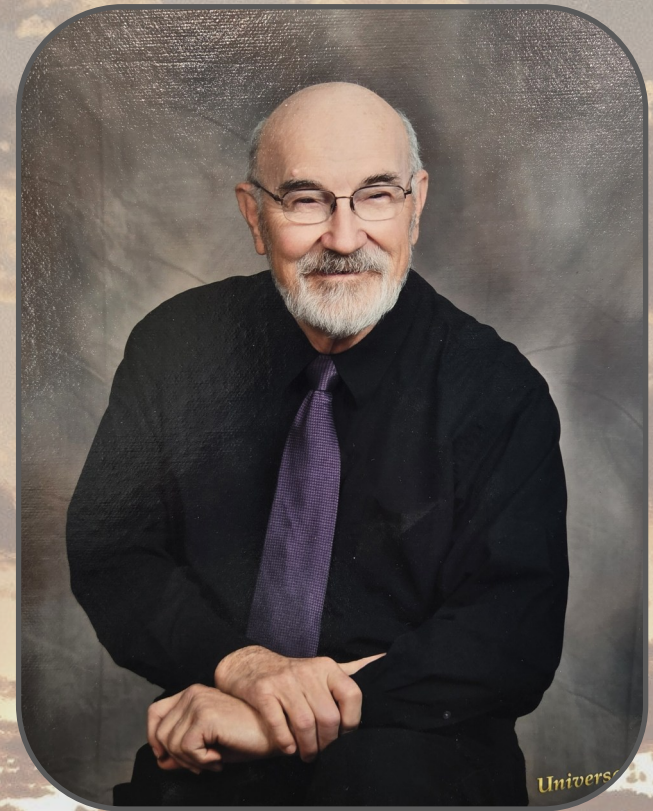
*6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all
