lie down in green pastures:

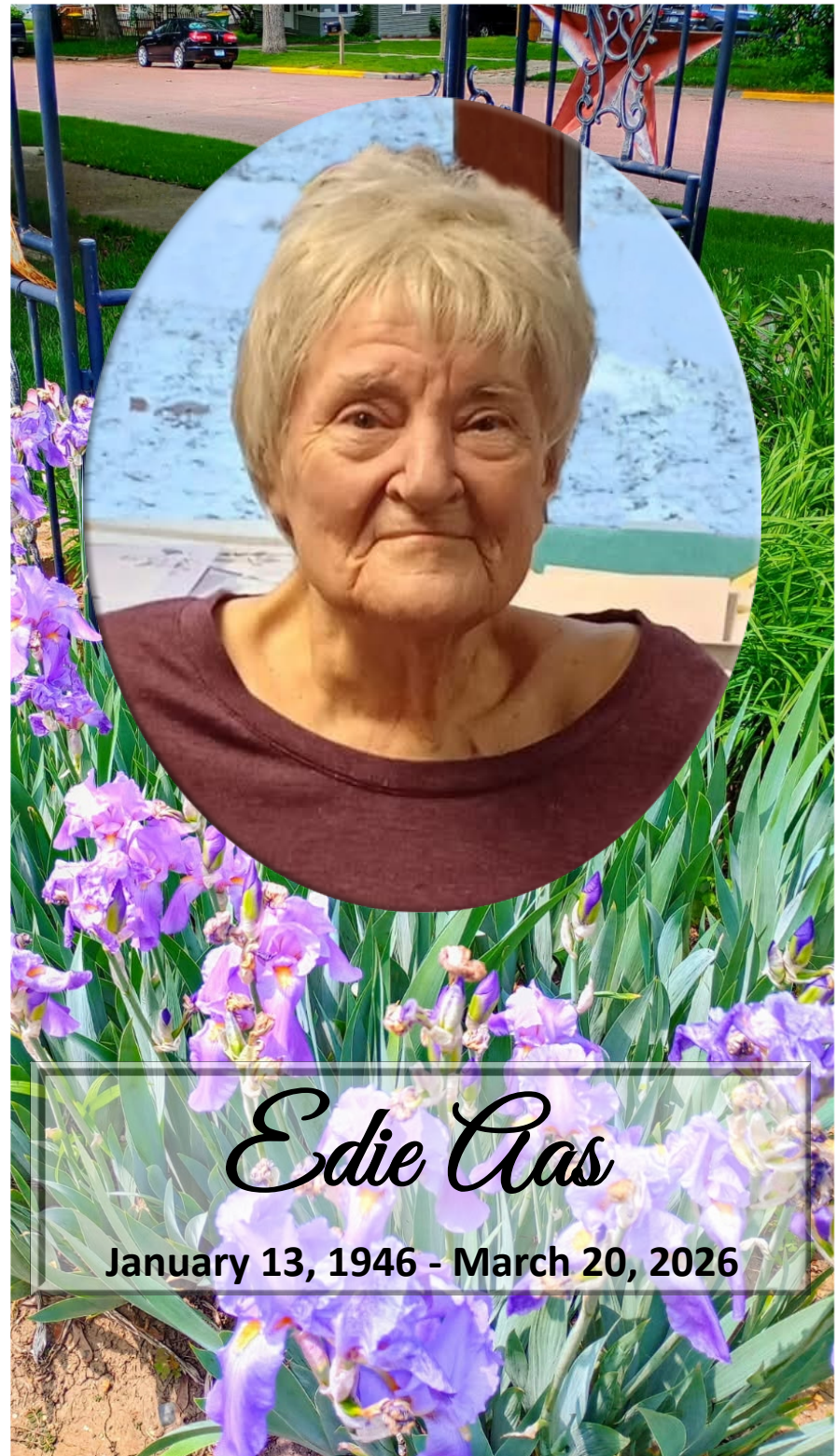
He leadeth me beside the still waters,

Edith Christina Aas was born to Harold and Alda (Steiger) Berg on January 13, 1946 in Baker, Montana. She was raised and received her education in Rhame, North Dakota. After her graduation from Rhame High School in 1964, she attended Humboldt Business College in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Upon completion of her education, Edie worked for a travel agency and then the American Lutheran Church headquarters. On April 4, 1970, she was united in marriage to Gordon Aas in Windom, Minnesota. Following their marriage, they lived in Windom for a short time before moving to Tyler, Minnesota. In 1971, they moved to Jasper, Minnesota where Edie worked part-time at various jobs, including the school. She also worked as the church custodian and cleaned for several people in Jasper.
