Church, where she faithfully served and eventually received the honor of becoming Mother of the Church. Her faith in God remained an important part of her life and the legacy she leaves behind.

Bobbie Jean received her education at Montgomery High School in Louise, Mississippi, where she was a proud member of the Class of 1961. She later attended LeMoyne-Owen College, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 1994.

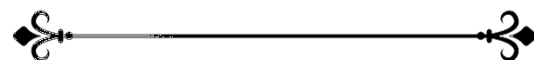

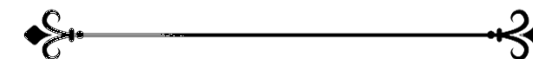
