## Her story

Ronette Mitchell was born on August 21, 1958, in Chester, Pennsylvania, to Robert and Barbara Mitchell. She passed peacefully in her sleep on March 27, 2026, at Lankenau Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Ronette, affectionately known as “SheShe,” received her early education in the Chester Upland School District in Chester, Pennsylvania. In 1976, she graduated from Chester High School, where she was also a cheerleader. During that time, she met Mike Mills (deceased), and from that union her first daughter, Micha, was born.

In 1980, SheShe moved to Philadelphia with her then-partner, Albert Weaver (deceased). From that union, Monica, Devita, and Alvita were born. SheShe eventually settled in North Philadelphia on Bonsall Street, where she lovingly raised her children. Over the years, Bonsall Street became much more than a place she lived. It became home. The neighbors became family, and SheShe often spoke about how “special” Bonsall Street was to her because of the love, support, and kindness she received from the moment she moved there, especially while raising her young children.

Ronette met Terrell Moon in 1986, and the two were married in 1993. Although their marriage lasted for a number of years, the love, friendship, and bond they shared remained long afterward.

A devoted and hardworking woman, SheShe spent many years as an in-home daycare provider while raising her children. She also attended many skills trainings and workshops at Temple University throughout the years, earning multiple certifications. Ronette later worked for the National Publishing Company in Northeast Philadelphia before eventually relocating back to Chester, Pennsylvania.

SheShe was a faithful member of Enon Baptist Church, where she attended services virtually every Sunday. In her younger years, she was known for her creativity and talent, especially for making the once-popular rhinestone and sequin jackets for neighbors and loved ones. She enjoyed traveling with her daughters whenever she could, and one of her proudest and most cherished moments was seeing her granddaughter, Jonai, graduate from Cheyney University in 2025.

More than anything, Ronette loved her family. She found her greatest joy in spending time with her grandchildren, talking with them, encouraging them, and celebrating each of their accomplishments. Her love was steady, genuine, and deeply felt by all who knew her.

Ronette was preceded in death by her father, Robert “Bobby” Mitchell, Sr., and her older brother, Robert “Poppy” Mitchell, Jr.

She leaves to cherish her memory her loving daughters, Micha Mitchell, Monica Mitchell, Devita “Rita” Mitchell, and Alvita “Emma” Weaver-Robertson, along with her son-in-law, Malik Robertson. She also leaves behind her bonus daughters, Shameka, Nakeesha, and Alieka, and her goddaughter, Ayanna Garrett.

She is also survived by her mother, Barbara Mitchell and siblings Renee Mackey, Ryan Mitchell, Ruthie Glascoe, and Rozlyn Mitchell.

SheShe also leaves behind her cherished grandchildren, Shane, Ra'shai, Malachai, Sydney, Zion, Kaleb, Kori, Kayden, Jonai, Jace, Emori, Emoni, Mariah, and Novah. And one great-grand daughter Sarai Armani.

She also leaves to mourn a host of cousins, friends, neighbors, and loved ones, including her nieces Colette, Ashly, Kelly, Kimberly, and Jamirah, and her nephews Aaron and Tony.
