2 He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

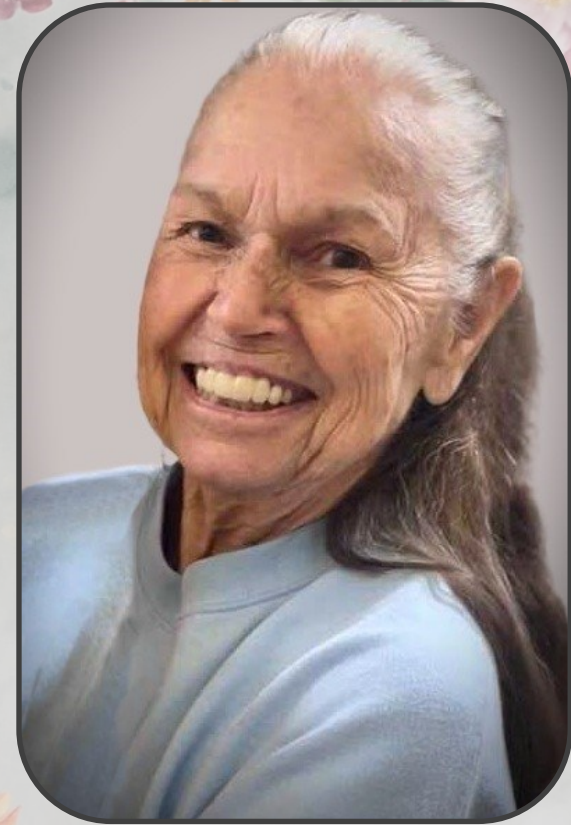
3 He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.
