There within your Heart*

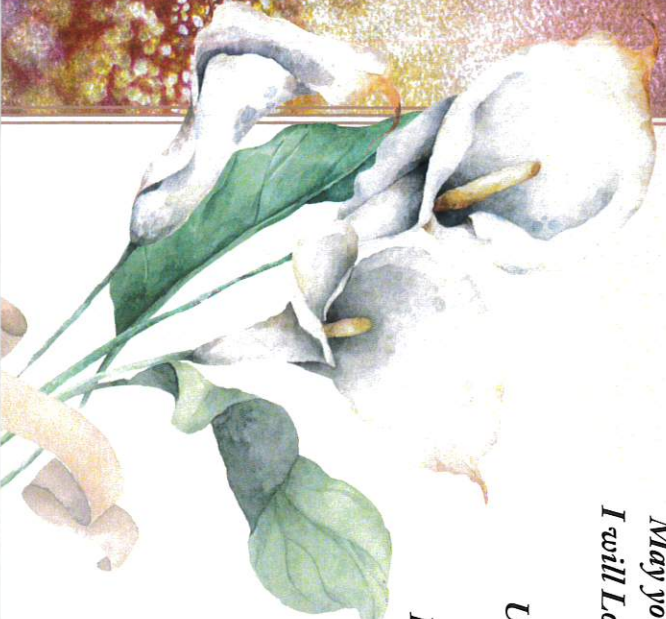
