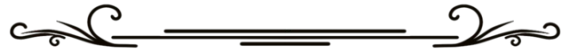

Why cry for a soul set free?*

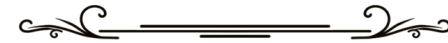
*Miss me a little, but not for long
