

Bradley William “Bill” Payne


September 14, 1958 - March 20, 2022

Bradley William “Bill” Payne was born “Bradley Leif Payne” in Alhambra, California to Donald Lee and Shirley Lou (Tykeson) Payne September 14, 1958. His dad being a sales representative and former military showed that Bill moved a lot and made many friends along the way. From California, to Walla Walla, to Billings, and eventually ending up in Eugene in adolescence, where he attended Marist High school before joining the navy at age 17. He changed his name to Bradley William, (going by Bill) after his uncle Bill, who he adored and with whom he spent most of his summers. He served as a technician on the USS Kittyhawk.
