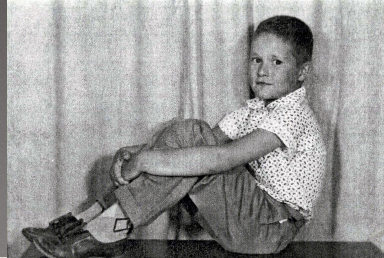
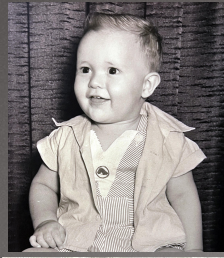

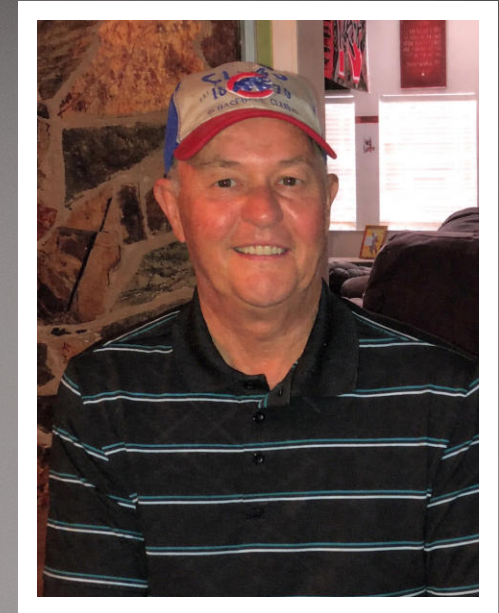


He Is Gone

or you can smile because he has lived.

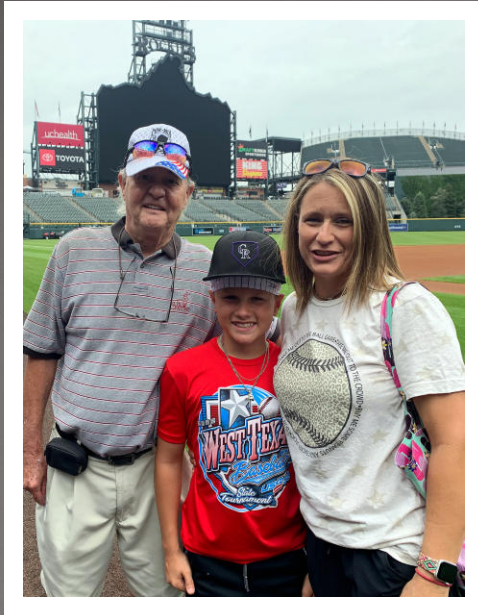
You can close your eyes and pray that he'll
