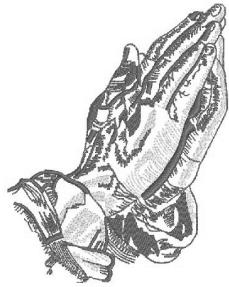


Because the Angels Came

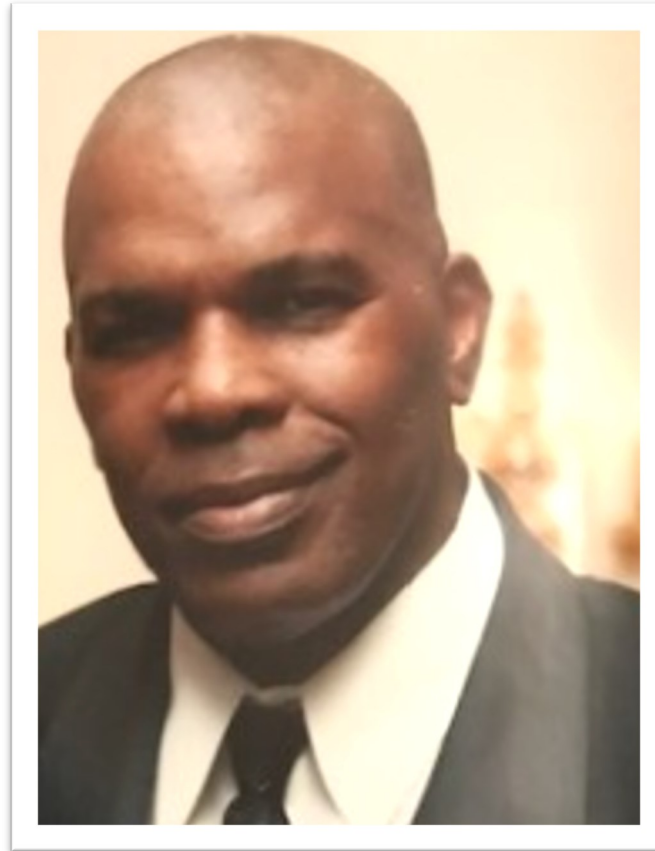
