

Margaret "Margie" Mary Anderson was born on September 21, 1928 in Ellsworth, Minnesota to William and Margaret (Schommer) Bofenkamp. She was baptized at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Ellsworth. Margie grew up in Ellsworth with her nine siblings and graduated from Ellsworth Catholic School in 1946. Margie moved to Sioux Falls, South Dakota to attend nursing school to become an LPN. On July 20, 1961, Margie was united in marriage to Toby Anderson in Ellsworth. They settled in Luverne where they were blessed with two children, Julie (Wesley) Obritsch and Timothy (Barb) Anderson.
