I'm in the shelter of His hands.

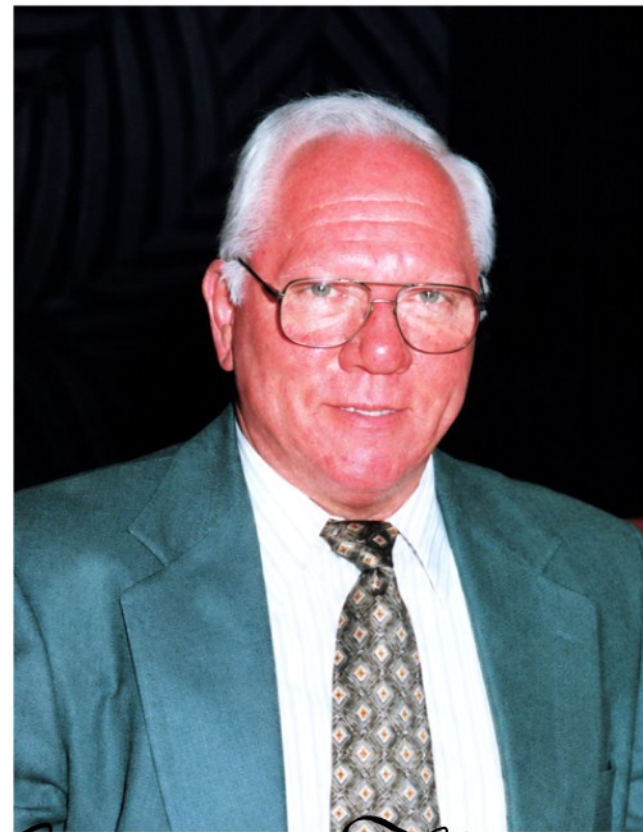
Here there is no sadness,
