Life Story

PHYLLIS ANN MALLOY, lovingly known as “Ann” by her family and close friends, was born on November 17, 1946, in Elizabeth City, North Carolina, to the late Edna Franklin Cox and Johnny Cox. She was the oldest of their four daughters but was raised alongside a host of beloved cousins — the Spences, the Bowes, and the Cartwrights — who were like siblings to her. This large, extended family meant the world to Ann, and her deep devotion to them was unwavering. Family was her foundation, and she made sure everyone around her knew just how important they were.

Ann attended school in Elizabeth City and graduated from P.W. Moore High School, although she spent a brief time at William C. Jason High School in Delaware. After graduating, she returned to Delaware to live with her mother and three younger sisters. It was there that she accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior while attending the Pentecostal Church of God in Lincoln, Delaware. She became the first director of the church’s newsletter, *The Pentecostal Highlights*, and led a gospel group with her sisters, “The Cox Sisters.”

Later, Ann moved to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where she met and married Richard Pollard. From this union came the greatest joy of her life — her daughter, Corie Regin. While in Philadelphia, Ann became a devoted member of Jones Memorial Baptist Church. Under the leadership of Rev. Ronald W. Johnson, her faith deepened, and she served with grace and dedication as a Deaconess. Her church family became an extension of her own, and she cherished them deeply.

Although her first marriage ended in divorce, Ann would later find a boundless and enduring love with Thomas Michael Malloy. Their marriage was filled with happiness, love, and mutual admiration until Tom’s untimely passing in November 1997. At just 5’2”, Ann had found her perfect match in Tom, who stood at 6’5”. The two made a striking pair, and Ann, ever the fashionista, delighted in wearing her signature high heels — as tall as her heart desired — next to her tall and loving husband. She embraced Tom’s family as her own, affectionately referring to them as her “family-in-love,” and they returned her love in full measure.

Ann built a successful career as an Executive Assistant at Johnson Matthey, a global leader in sustainable technologies and specialty chemicals. Even after retirement, she remained committed to growth and learning, proudly earning her Master of Business Administration from Eastern University — a remarkable achievement that reflected her lifelong pursuit of excellence. She adored her 3 grandchildren, whom she believed to be the best looking and most perfect kids ever born. And she delighted in spoiling them with things like a Disney vacation or their very own swing set/jungle gym for their backyard. One of her last earthly joys was seeing photos of her youngest grandson, graduating from college this past May to which she said, “All three of my grandchildren are now college graduates, what a blessing. My God is good!”

Phyllis Ann was preceded in death by her parents, Edna and Johnny Cox; her husband, Thomas M. Malloy; and two of her sisters, Judy Faye Cox and Sharon Dianna Mason.

She leaves behind a legacy of love, faith, and resilience.
