HER STORY

Evangelist Vergie Mae Adams Butler, a daughter of John Henry Adams Sr. and Sophie Davis Adams, was born on January 3, 1957, in Berkeley County, South Carolina. On September 22, 2025, she finished her earthly journey and entered eternal rest with her Lord and Savior.

Vergie was a true fighter and prayer warrior. She faced many hard times in life, but she never lost her faith in God. Even during sickness and struggle, she boldly declared, “God is good!” Her life was proof that prayer and faith can overcome any obstacle. She never gave up and never stopped trusting the Lord.

In October 2005, Vergie’s physical health took a tragic turn when she was jogging and struck by an automobile in Pensacola, Florida. She was brought back to South Carolina with significant injuries. But by God’s grace, Vergie survived and continued to live for 20 more years. Her determination, along with the loving commitment of her daughter Brandy—who never gave up on her—was a powerful witness of faith, hope, and the will to live.

Vergie attended the public schools of Berkeley County. She later married the late Marshall Vernon Butler, and together they were blessed with three children who were the joy of her life. She dearly loved her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She prayed for them daily, encouraged them, and stood by them with a mother’s unwavering love.

She was a faithful member of Cainhoy Miracle Revival Center in Huger, SC, where she served until she moved to West Florida. Vergie loved the Word of God and often leaned on her favorite scripture, Psalm 23:4: “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me.” These words gave her peace and courage through life’s toughest moments.

Vergie also enjoyed the simple blessings of life. She loved knitting, fishing, gardening, and hosting yard sales. She especially loved planting fruits and vegetables, which she gladly shared with her family and neighbors.

Vergie will be remembered as a faithful servant of God, a woman of prayer, and a loving mother whose light will continue to shine in the lives of all who knew her.
