Tyrone Carter's story began on March 2, 1962, in the Bronx, New York, born to the late Henry Carter and Mary Francis Durant. From the very beginning, Tyrone carried a spirit that was full of life, love, and individuality. On June 11, 2026, he peacefully transitioned from this life, embraced in the eternal comfort of his Savior, Jesus Christ. As a young boy, Tyrone's journey carried him from New York to South Carolina, where he spent formative years. He attended Maywood High School in Sumter and later graduated from Mt. Pleasant High School in Elliott, South Carolina, in May 1980. But beyond school, it was the love of family that defined those years.

Tyrone often spoke fondly of his paternal grandparents, affectionately known to him as "Mama" and "Daddy." Their love, wisdom, and guidance left an imprint on his heart that never faded. Family was everything to Tyrone. He loved and stood firmly by those he cared about. His bond with his younger sister, Shawana Dell, was especially dear to him. He never hesitated to express that love, often saying with pride, "I don't care what anyone says, my sister loves me, and I love my sister." And with a smile, he would confidently remind others that his mother had the smartest children. Tyrone didn't just live life; he embraced it. He took pride in his appearance and loved looking sharp. He stayed on top of the latest styles, especially when it came to his sneakers. For Tyrone, it wasn't just about fashion; it was about feeling good, looking good, and expressing who he was. Tyrone will be remembered for his candor and spirit. He had a way of leaving an impression not just through what he said, but through how he made people feel. His presence brought a sense of connection that will never be forgotten. Tyrone's journey was not without loss.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Roland and Susie May Carter; his parents, Henry Carter and Mary Francis Durant; his brother, Jamal Durant; his son, Tyquan Fennell; and one sister. Though their absence was felt deeply, he carried their memory with him throughout his life.

Today, his legacy continues through those he loved. He leaves behind his sons, Treva Moses and Tyrone Jones, and his grandchildren, Trea'Veon, TyAsia, Elijah, Taeden, Bryson, Malaki, Ocean and Dajhon along with his great-grandchildren, Kairo and JaQaun, who will grow up hearing stories of his life.
