



James was born on October 22, 1937, in Wilmar, Minnesota, to Ernest and Maxine (Dahl) Myers. The family later settled in Stratford, Iowa, where he attended school and graduated from Stratford High School.

He farmed near Blairsburg and held a variety of jobs throughout his life, including farming near Blairsburg, working at a grocery store in Stanhope, Eichma's Women's Clothing Store, and Grandville's Men's Shop in Webster City. He also owned and operated a Kentucky Fried Chicken franchise for two years before beginning a long career at Van Diest Supply, where he served as shipping and receiving supervisor.



James met the love of his life, Janice Peck, when they sang together in the church choir. They were married on April 7, 1962, at Calvary Baptist Church in



Webster City, beginning a devoted partnership that lasted more than six decades.

Music was always an important part of his life—he played the trumpet in a dance band, sang duets with Janice, and often lent his voice to weddings and funerals. Beyond music, he enjoyed painting



landscapes on both canvas and doors, hunting deer and pheasant, and fishing—especially trips to Canada with his co-workers. He was a faithful member of Anchor Point Baptist Church in Webster City.
