

Thomas "Tom" Robert Frankenfield, 76, of McPherson, KS, passed away on Friday, November 14, 2025, at his home.

He was born on May 19, 1949, in Bethlehem, PA, the son of Robert E. and Helen E. (Nicholas) Frankenfield. Tom graduated from Liberty High School in Bethlehem, PA. He received his bachelor's degree from United States Military Academy at West Point, NY and master's degree from Lehigh University in Northampton County, PA. On January 5, 1991, he was united in marriage to Judith A. Casey at St. Nicholas Church in Wilkes-Barre, PA.

Tom proudly served his country for 23 years as a Regular Army Officer. His service in the

United States Army spanned from June 9, 1971, to August 31, 1994, culminating in the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. A few places Tom served in his 23 years of service are Korea, Germany, Kansas (Ft. Riley & Ft. Leavenworth), Pennsylvania, Washington D.C., and the Pentagon. He was a member of American Legion Post #24 and was dedicated to supporting military burial honors.
