Don't lengthen it now with undue grief.

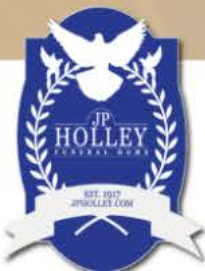
Lift up your hearts and share with me,
