Dennis J. McCullough, 72, of Sedalia, MO, passed away at his home on Saturday, January 4, 2025. He was born on January 10, 1952, in Lodi, OH, to Jack McCullough and Mary Charlene (McDonald) McCullough, both of whom preceded him in death.

On April 19, 1975, in Sedalia, MO, he married Amy L. Nye, who survives him.

Dennis was a 1971 graduate of Northwestern High School in West Salem, OH. After graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force, serving honorably from 1971 to 1975 as a heavy equipment operator in Guam. Following his military service, Dennis worked as a newspaper printing press operator for Gowe Printing, the Sedalia Democrat, and later for the Columbia Tribune, retiring in 2014.
