voices take up a glad shout:*

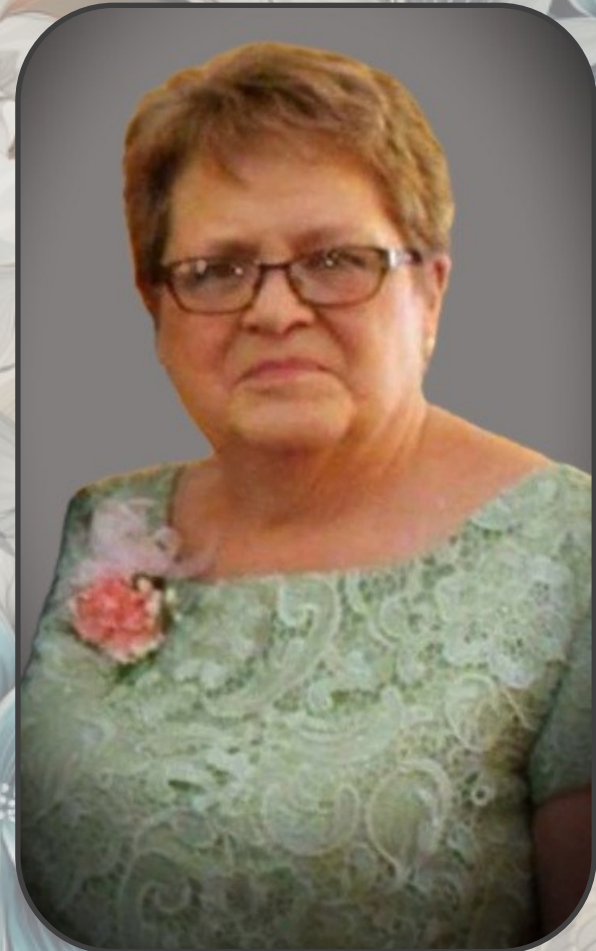
*“There she comes!”*
