Vera Mae Todd Beauchamp was born to Abner Todd and Elizabeth Blackdog in Wiota, MT on November 9, 1935. Mom was raised in Wiota on the family farm along with her siblings, Donald, Larry, Kenny, Kermit, Maynard, Palmer, Lyle, Douglas, Winona "Dodee" and Cathy Todd.

At a young age shew as taught how to care for the animals on the farm, feeding and watering the horses, cows, goats, ducks, and chickens. Also helping with the large garden and yearly haying. When she was younger, she couldn't wait for school to get over so she could race home to saddle up her horse and go riding.

Mom attended school in the Wiota-Nashua area and Glasgow. Later on in life she met and married Roy Albert Beauchamp in Glasgow on November 1954.
