of righteousness for his name's sake.*

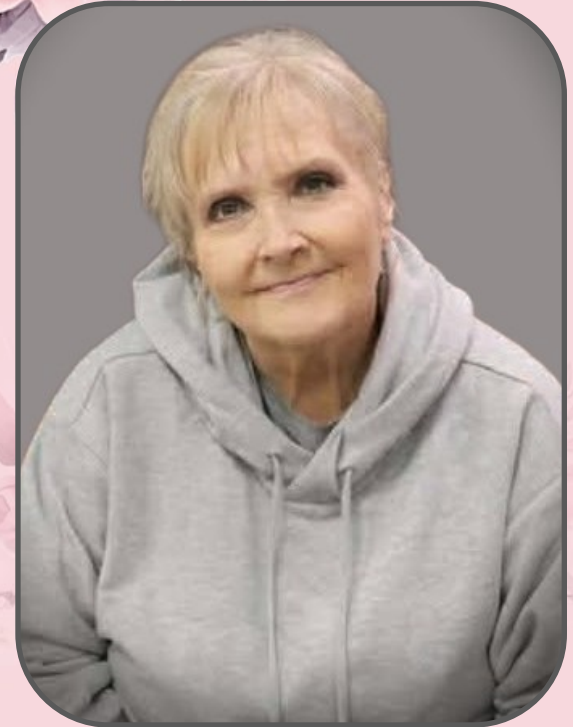
*4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the
