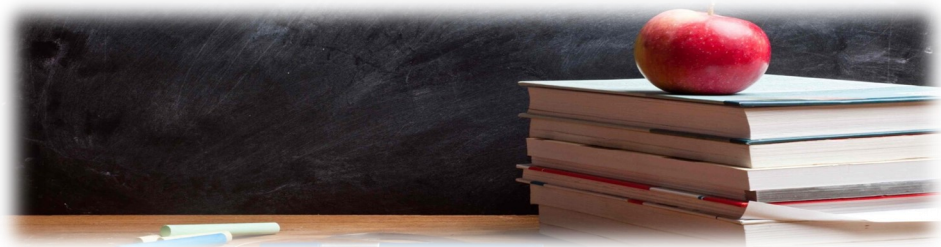




## Legacy of Love
