


Obituary

“Be yourself; everyone else is already taken”

On Tuesday, March 25, 2025, the precious life of **Johnny Reese Brown**, 81 years young, ended at Ochsner Laird Hospital in Union, Mississippi. Johnny Reese Brown was born June 23, 1943, in DeKalb, Mississippi to Mr. Coleman Brown and Mrs. Lee Murray Brown.

Johnny Reese was preceded in death by his parents, Mr. Coleman and Mrs. Lee Murray Brown, two brothers, Virgil L. Brown, Ronald Brown one sister, Mary R. Triplett, and his grandson, Chase Morgan.

Johnny Reese graduated from Booker T. Washington High School, and from Utica College as a Barber Major. In the mid-sixties and early seventies, he was extremely active in the Civil Rights Movement and worked as a community organizer spanning the state of Mississippi. Receiving death threats did **NOT** cause him to pause his work. **He was fearless!** His employment history included Child Development Group of Mississippi (*CDGM*) in Jackson, Mississippi, International Harvester in Rock Island, Illinois, Navistar in Springfield, Ohio and a barber in Philadelphia, Mississippi. He loved spending time gardening.






My Grandpa was a standup guy and a well-respected man. He took me on plenty of adventures as a child, and taught me a lot. He will truly be missed and loved.




