HUBERT G. AMORY




In Nevis, Hubert spent time working as a postman with his stepfather, Lionel Brown. Then, Hubert moved to Nevis' sister island of St. Kitts,




where he worked at the Power Station for several years. Once in the United States, he spent time working as a shift manager and then he worked at Echo Data where he retired after sixteen years.

—Psalm 73:26




Even while experiencing hardships and sickness, Hubert continued to praise the Lord for His greatness, His faithfulness, and His mercy to us.


