# David Ray Kammerich

David Ray Kammerich, 81, of Sedalia, MO, passed away on Thursday, November 28, 2024, at his home. He was born on September 4, 1943, in Sedalia, the son of Leonard Francis Kammerich and Hilda Marie (Schroeder) Kammerich, who preceded him in death.

On August 2, 1969, in Sedalia, MO, he was united in marriage to Linda S. Schupp, who resides in their home.

Dave was a 1961 graduate of Smith-Cotton High School. He attended college at Central Missouri State University, Warrensburg, MO. Dave worked as a machine operator for Alcan Cable for 35 years, retiring in 2006.
