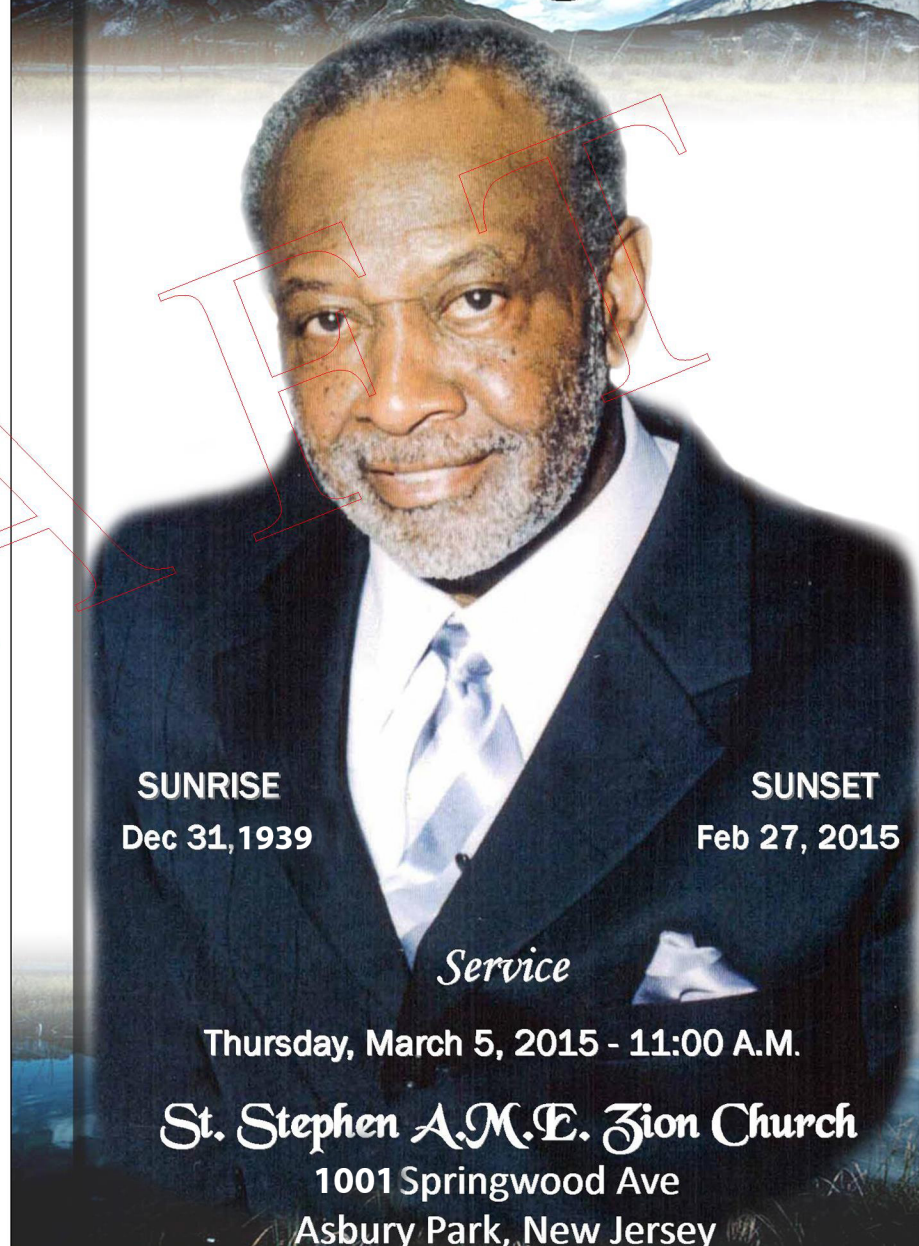

Obituary
