Those in the business described Tommy as a dependable man of integrity. Known for handshake deals and steadfast follow-through, Tommy worked tirelessly for many years to provide for his family.

Tommy met his beloved wife, Alison Knox, in 1991. After seven years of dating, they married on February 6, 1999. Their partnership spanned 35 years, bound by love, laughter and mutual respect. Together, they raised four children—Austin, Alyse, Ashton, and Adelyn—who were Tommy's proudest accomplishment and the greatest joy in his life.

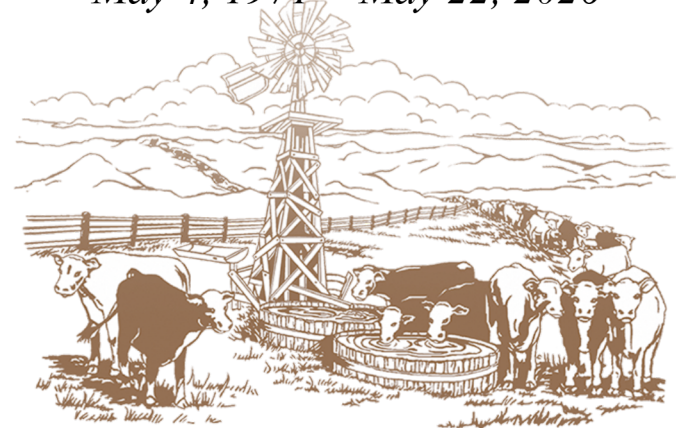
