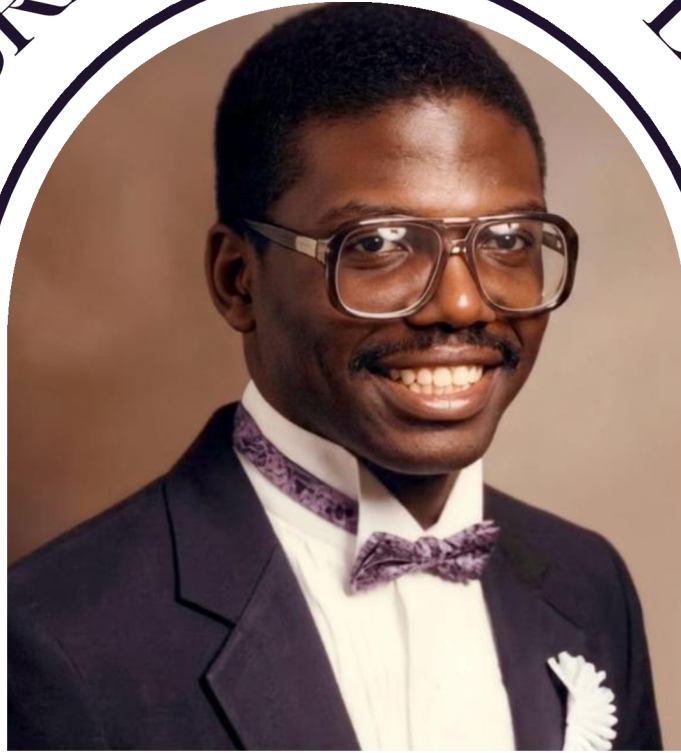

Rene Michel Jules Goueth, age 70, passed away in Los Angeles on March 4, 2026.
