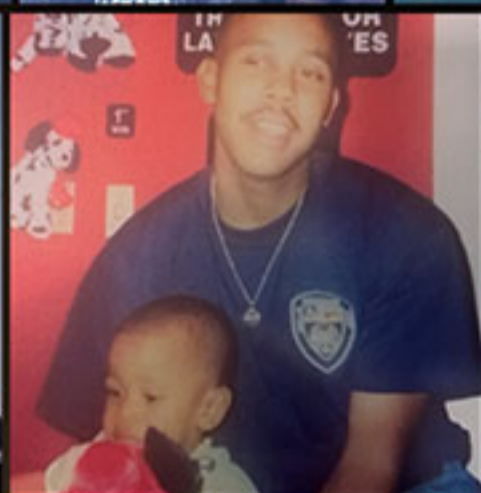
Pops,
