Beauty was a faithful member of Wesley United Methodist Church, where she served until her health declined. She was a God-fearing woman whose life reflected the wisdom found in Proverbs 31—a woman of strength, compassion, dignity, and virtue.

On November 22, 1939, Beauty was united in marriage to Lewis Richardson. Together, they built a life grounded in family and commitment. Their union was blessed with children, and, throughout the years, Beauty’s home and heart became places where family could find love, guidance, encouragement, and care.

Beauty believed helping others was part of life. Her everyday kindness, wisdom, generosity, and quiet strength blessed all who knew her.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Lewis Richardson; her daughter, Florence Hubbard; and her son, Archie Richardson.
