OBITUARY

Mrs. Alzonía (nee Guyton) Evans (92) was one of two children born to the late Lucinda (nee Hayes/Guyton) Milton (103). Mrs. Evans was born September 12, 1933, in Dublin Georgia. She moved on to Live with the Lord on Mother's Day.

Alzonía came North to Cleveland, Ohio in 1944 with her mother Lucinda Milton, and her brother Alex Guyton.

She was a nice, gentle & quiet, compassionate young thin girl about 9 years of age, the protector of her younger brother Lil Bro (Alex) age 6. Her favorite color was Blue as you may have observed Family & Friends wearing some type of Blue to Represent. But don't get it Twisted and take her silence for granted, sometimes Red because she was full of Spunk & Fire and didn't hesitate to check you straight, and didn't take "Any" mess. Within that union they had four children: Gail, Venita, Janet, and Ewatis Jr. Ewatis Sr. was a Proud Barber, Owner of Ashbury Barbershop at 11019 Ashbury, Cleveland, Ohio. He Proudly provided and Supported his family. Alzonía was also a Proud mom raising her four children. Both Alzonía & Ewatis had very unique first names. They were Both frequently addressed as "Evans". I guess my brother Ewatis Jr will have to hold it down and continue to carry that "Torch", and with the help of our cousin Anthony (Tony) Evans. Hubert and Daddy would be Proud.

After Alzonía's children grew of age, and once the last one was out of High School she then worked in the Cosmetology profession as a hairdresser at Bea's Beauty shop.
