LIFE REFLECTIONS

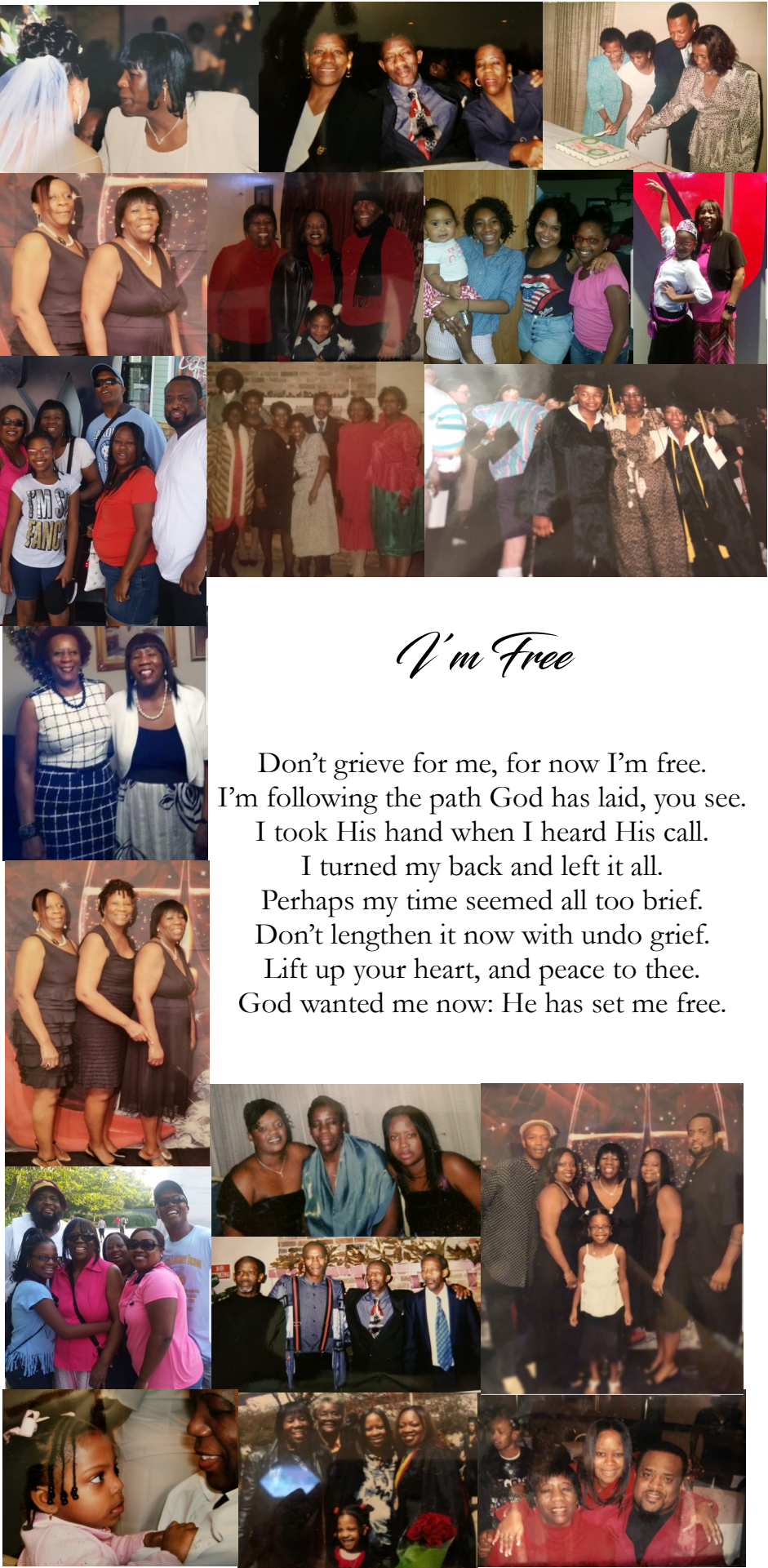
