Lloyd Lee Hughey, 80, of North Little Rock, AR, passed away on July 24, 2026, with his devoted, loving wife of 29 years, Judy, by his side.

Born on August 31, 1945, to Charles and Gussie Hughey, he is preceded in death by his parents; his twelve older siblings, including nine brothers and three sisters.

There are people whose lives are measured not by the years they lived, but by the lives they touched. He was one of those people.

Lloyd was a loyal Razorback fan, an avid fisherman and skilled hunter who found joy in God's creation. Whether cheering on the Hogs, standing quietly beside a lake, or walking through the woods. He appreciated the beauty, peace, and wonder of the world God created. Those moments reflected something about who he was—a man of patience, perseverance, and gratitude.

After having served his country in the United States Air Force, he later built a successful drywall and painting business, not only through skill and hard work, but through honesty, integrity, and the respect he showed everyone he met. He helped others because that was simply who he was. Many have stories of his kindness, his willingness to lend a hand, his quiet encouragement, or his thoughtful generosity. He never needed applause; seeing someone else helped was enough.

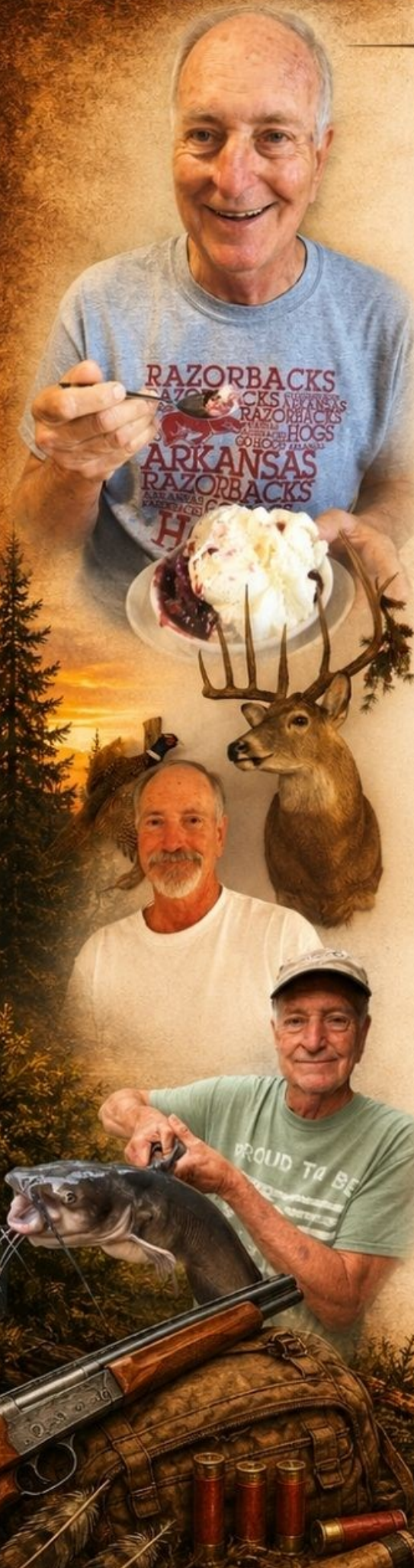
His life reminds us that true greatness is found in serving others.
