Margaret Ellen Dixon Tucker, 88, of White Plains, New York, entered eternal rest on August 24, 2025.

Born on December 31, 1936, in Rose Hill, North Carolina, she was the daughter of the late Addie Mae Brinson Dixon and Hubert Dixon. Margaret was the fourth of seven children and grew up in Rose Hill, where she received her early education.

A gifted student, Margaret graduated as valedictorian of Charity High School in 1954. That fall, she enrolled at Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina, to study business. In pursuit of greater opportunities, she later moved to New York, where she began a long and successful career with AT&T. Dedicated and diligent, she rose to management and

faithfully served the company for 25 years until her retirement in 1994.

On December 19, 1957, Margaret married Vernon Tucker. Together they were blessed with two daughters, Jacqueline and Denise. Vernon preceded her in death in 1974. In later years, Margaret shared her life with her beloved companion, Ronald O. Walker, Sr., until his passing in 2018.

For more than five decades, Margaret was a resident of White Plains and a devoted member of Union Baptist Church in Greenburgh, New York. Deeply rooted in her faith, she actively supported church ministries and community initiatives. Her life was a testament to devotion—to God, to family, and to service.



She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Vernon Tucker; her companion, Ronald O. Walker, Sr.; her brother, Johnnie Dixon; and her sisters, Lessie Pearl Dixon, DeLois Spearman, and Dorsette Dean Dixon Upshur.


