he leadeth me beside the still waters.

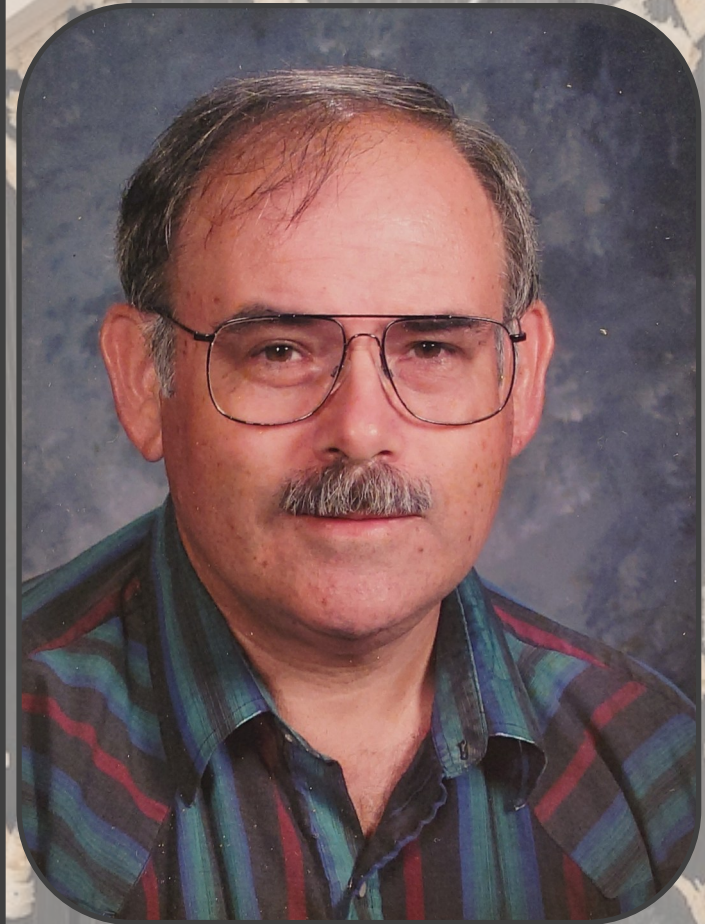
3 He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths
