


Obituary

Sue Campbell Dodd, 99, of Denison (formerly of Waco), TX died on January 8, 2025 at Texoma Medical Center in Denison, Texas. Memorial services and interment will be January 15, 2025, 1:30 p.m. at Waco Memorial Funeral Home and Cemetery. Sue Campbell was born March 18, 1925, in the town of West, Texas in McLennan County.
