He will be remembered with love, laughter, and gratitude for the time shared with him. Kaden



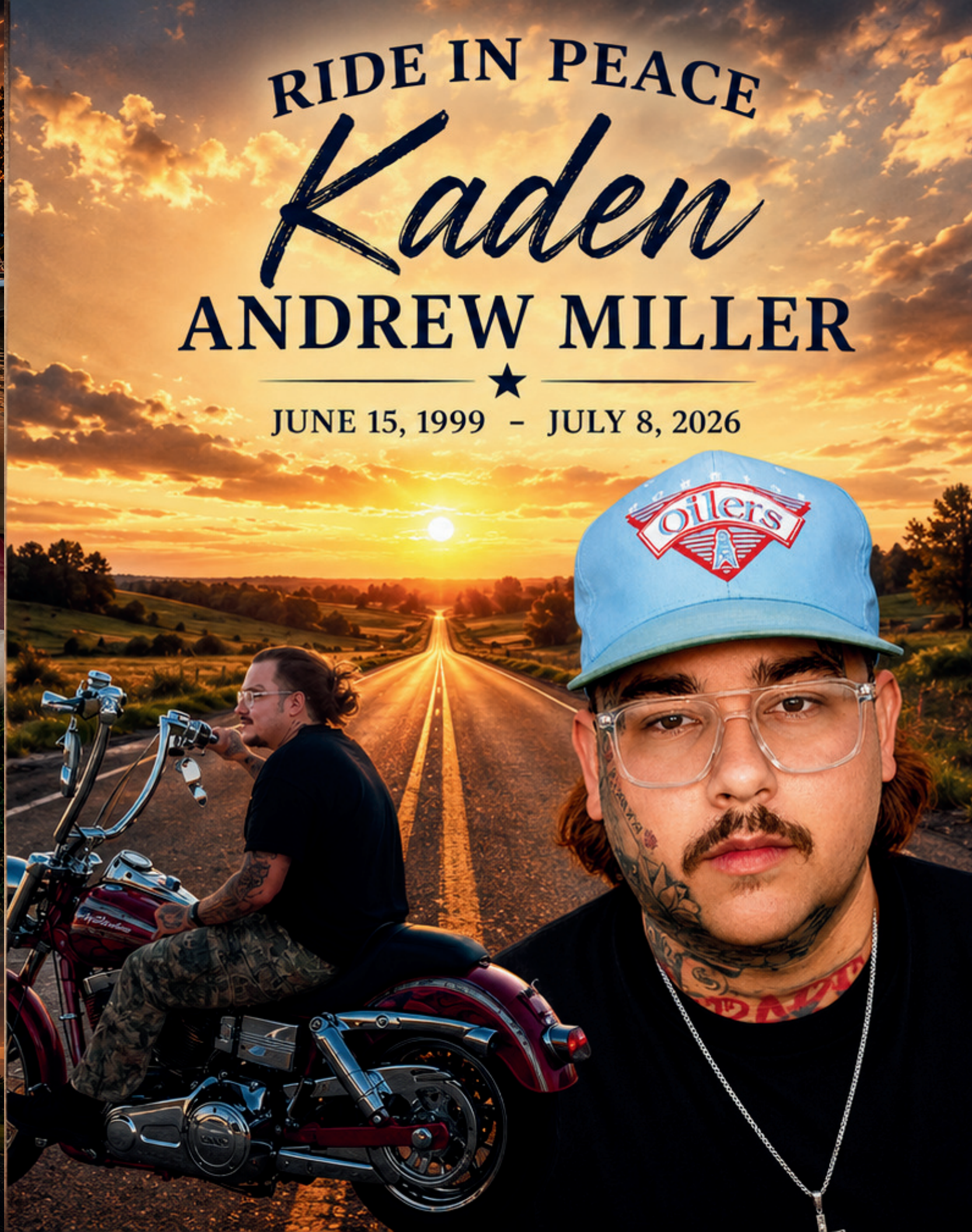
