


Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free

Glenna Mae Rose Fickbohm was born in Hudson, South Dakota on December 19th, 1943, to Densel and Rose Roberts. She was baptized and confirmed at Peace Lutheran Church in rural Sioux Center, Iowa. Glenna graduated from West Sioux High School in 1961 and attended Nettleton College. She worked at First National Bank in Sioux Center, Iowa. On November 30, 1963, she married Duane Fickbohm, and they

farmed in Sioux County for 60 years. She was a member of the Hawarden American Lutheran Church and served on several committees. In 1990, Glenna was one of the founders of the Arthritis Support Group in Hawarden, Iowa. Glenna was an active volunteer of the Hospice Program around Sioux Center.

Glenna died on Tuesday, February 11, 2025 at 6:30 p.m. surrounded by family at the Dougherty Hospice House in Sioux Falls, South Dakota at the age of 81.

Survivors are her husband, Duane of Sioux Center; son, Robin (Myong Chu) Fickbohm and daughter, Kim (Tom) Heeren.
