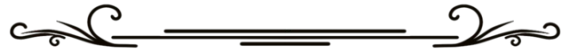

Miss me, but let me go.*

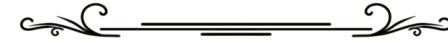
*For this is a journey we all must take
