I received a call from the hospital that he wasn't going to survive through the night. Frantic I cried out to Almighty God for help, and after arriving at the hospital I found out that my baby son had an undeveloped heart, and they wanted to try operating on him. However God stepped in and they couldn't. You see God healed him and that was the miracle to me. The Lord allowed Michael to live for 60years becoming a sailor, husband, father, and grandfather, You might wonder as you read this why I would choose to share this story, well it is to encourage, inspire, and motivate all to know that God does hear and answer prayers and that He still preforms miracles. Now, even though my heart is broken at this time at the loss of him, I also rejoice in the fact that God blessed me and my family with the precious gift of having my son for years.

Michael was an inspiration to all of us. When under extreme pressure and loss, he took on the role of having to leave his home in Washington, moving back to Las Vegas, and taking on the role of a single father. When he lost his sight, he didn't choose to be a burden on his family. He chose instead to step up to the challenge, going to the Major Charles Robert Soltes Rehabilitation Center in Long Beach, Calif. to receive training for living independently. Michael maintained his own private dwelling, he cooked, cleaned, Ironed his own clothes, worked on a special computer, and would even send out text messages.
