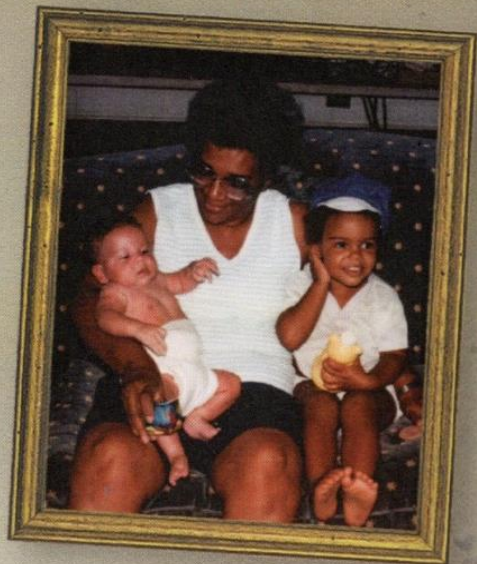


Jennie received her early education from the Coatesville area public school system. She attended the Historic James Adams School and was a 1947 graduate of S. Horace Scott Senior High School.
