



### **I Miss You My Sister**

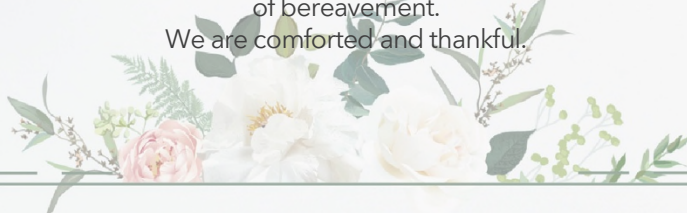
I thought of you with love today,
