Our beloved James Horace (“Jim”, “Hunkey”) White, age 85, of Dorchester Massachusetts departed this earthly life on August 21, 2024. Jim, as he was affectionately called by his wife, was born in Windfall, North Carolina on June 23, 1939 to the late Nellie Ferebee White and James Horace White Sr. He was one of 11 children. Siblings preceding him in death were Mary B. Hardy, Mary I. Burns, Wilson Leroy White, Charlie W. White, Thomas G. White, Herman G. White, Annie Ruth Harris, Alisha J. White, and Lautina B. White.

Jim attended the public schools in Perquimans County, NC; then he joined the United States Army where he served for three years. After his military career he relocated to Boston, Massachusetts.
