

Randy F. Wiens, resident of Shawnee, passed away on Monday, October 30, 2023. He was 64 years old.

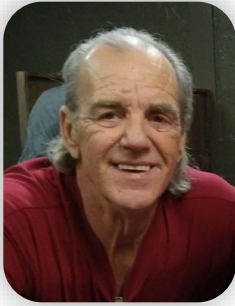
