MORGANTHOMAS, SR. was the son of the late Lillian Lovette of Jeanerette, LA. He was born on March 11, 1929. Morgan Sr. was one of four sons. He was a native of Jeanerette, LA where he lived for many years.

He joined the Army in 1947 where he served for two years. Following an Honorable Discharge, he returned home and resumed his life. He joined the American Legion Post in Jeanerette, LA (an organization which serves veterans) where he was a faithful member for 49 years. He helped to renovate the home that he lived in with his mother and brothers for many years. Many Saturdays were spent watching the wrestling matches on tv. He was known to enjoy travelling. Road trips, accompanied with his long-time companion - Ms. Lorraine Julia Bradley - were made to many destinations across the United States. Grandma Lillian, Morgan Sr., and his brothers were famously known for so excitedly watching each and every wrestling match every weekend with such joy and anticipation! They just couldn't hardly wait to see what "those dirty dogs" would do next and who would win each match! On many Sundays, following Church services at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church, Morgan Sr. could be found enjoying good company, delicious food, and good times with the Edwards (Ms. Ruby and Mr. Elton) family.

If we could choose from ALL of the grandpas in the world There's no doubt that we would choose you.

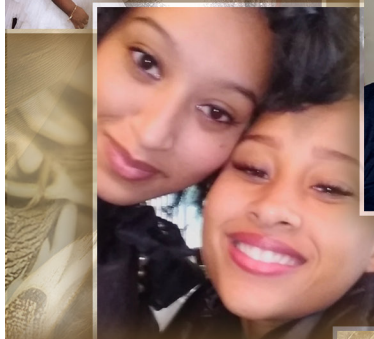
