Johnny's personality shone brightly through his love of storytelling, especially tales about the 1953 Waco Tornado, a story he recounted with vivid detail.

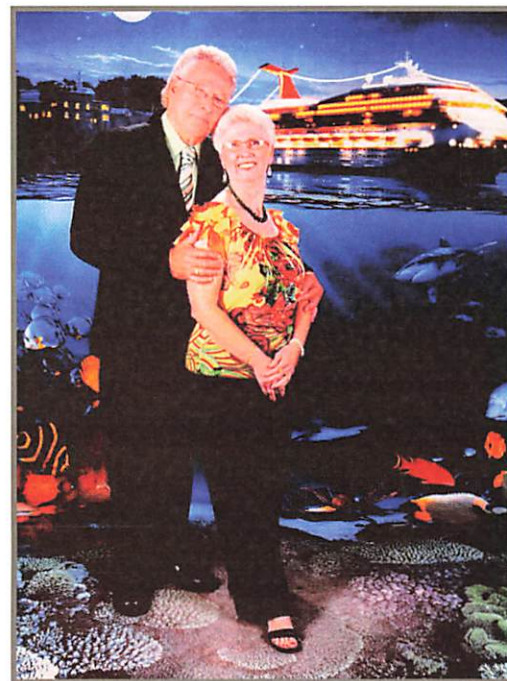

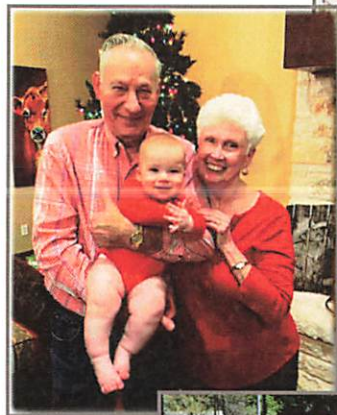
