Jordan had an energy for life and a

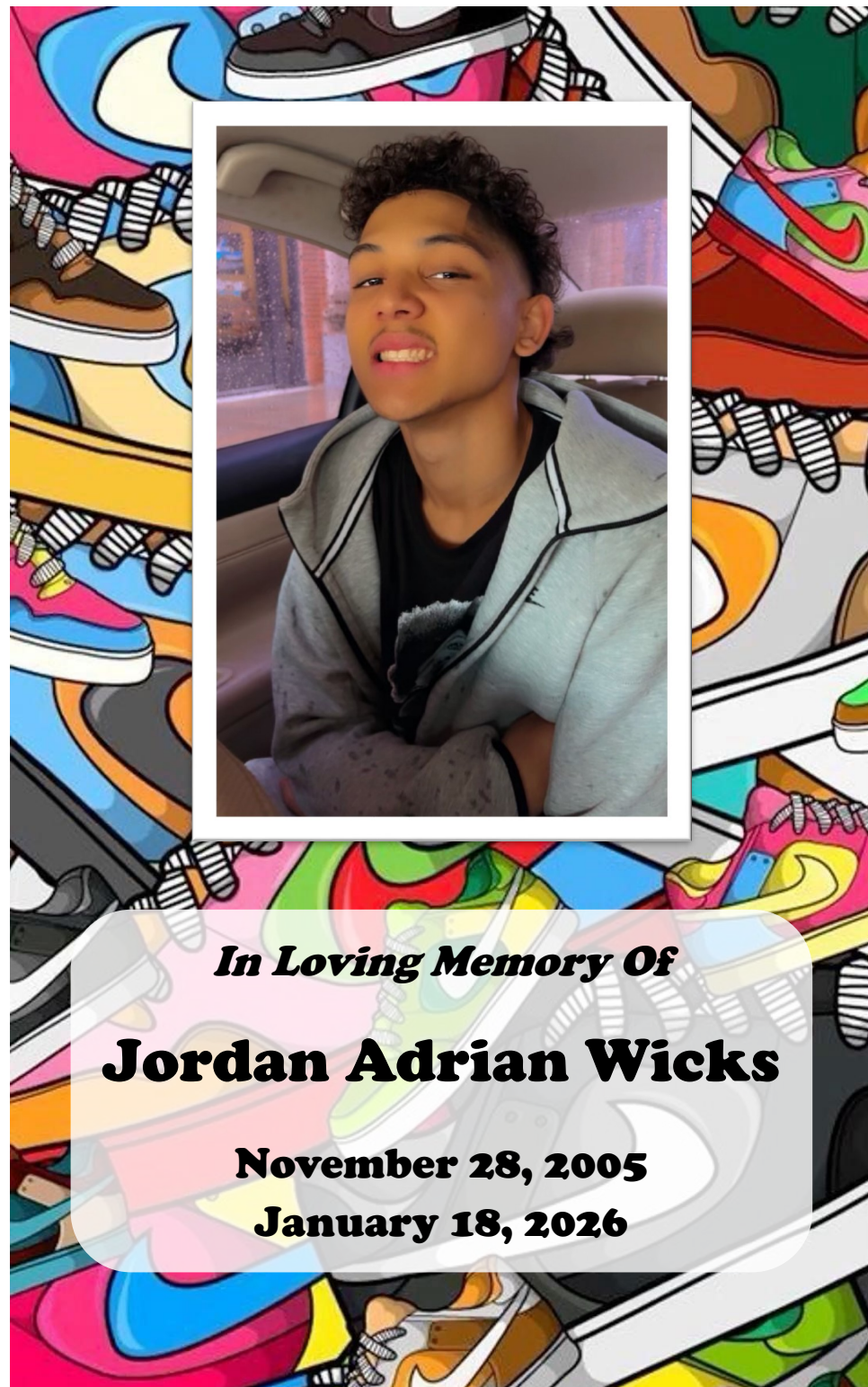

He was preceded in death by his great-grandparents and dog, Sheena.

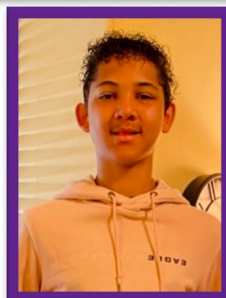
